

UNIFORM

To ensure that high standards of uniform are maintained and that the correct uniform is always being worn in the correct manner, morning registration will consist of a thorough check of personal appearance. In cases where personal appearance and uniform fails to adhere with the guidelines detailed, students will be sent to the Isolation Room until the matter is resolved in full. They will be offered appropriate Archway School uniform to wear for the day and return to lessons. Prohibited items of clothing (hoodies etc.) will be confiscated on sight. Refusal to remove prohibited items will result in a fixed term exclusion.

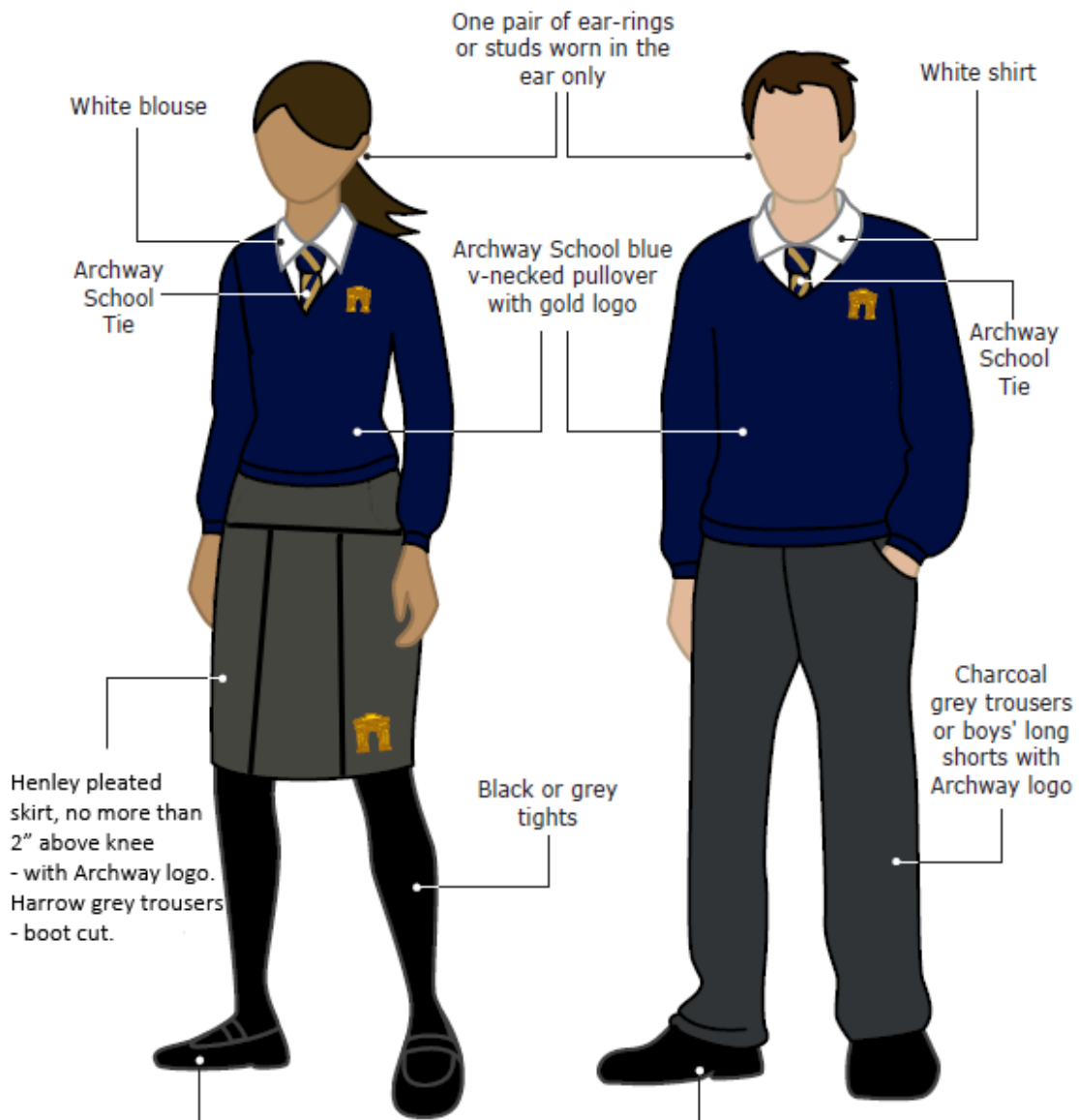
Tights must be black or grey. They must be thick and non-patterned. Thinner plain/tan tights or grey, white or black ankle socks may be worn in the summer.

Plain black **shoes** either flat or with low heels. Shoes must be plain, entirely black and should not be canvas or of a trainer style. Boots must not be worn in school although they may be worn on the journey to and from school.

Coats must not be worn in lessons, registration or assembly. Hoodies/optional fleece may only be worn when participating in a school sports event. They must not be worn at any other time or they will be confiscated.

The following applies to all students:

Jewellery:

The only jewellery which is acceptable is a wristwatch and stud type earrings. Any other form of jewellery is not allowed. Archway School does not allow facial piercings of any kind, including transparent piercing retainers. Students will be asked to remove any other piercings if they are visible. Failure to do so or putting them back in will result in the student spending the day in the Isolation Room where they will remain until any prohibited piercings are removed.

Hair:

No extreme hairstyle or extreme dyed hair is allowed; this includes tramlines and other shaved patterns, Mohican or skinhead-type styles. Students arriving in school with an unacceptable hairstyle will be sent to the Isolation Room. All students with long hair must tie it back for PE, Technology and Science lessons. Students will remain in the Isolation Room until any prohibited hair styles are returned to acceptable styles.

Parents/Carers please note: please make informed decisions with your children with respect to piercings and hair styles that may be changed during school holidays – If a student arrives on their first day back with prohibited styles or piercings they will be isolated immediately until the situation is resolved.

Make-Up:

Make up is not allowed in Years 7 & 8. A discreet amount of makeup is acceptable in Years 9, 10 and 11. Nail varnish is not allowed across all year groups. Year 9,10 & 11 students may wear a small amount of foundation, blusher and mascara. No extreme application of makeup. No colours. No lipstick or eyeshadow. Students are expected to respond to the notion of “discreet” with maturity. Students will be expected to remove makeup deemed by staff to be excessive.

If you feel a mobile phone is necessary for your child's security on the journey to and from school, it must be kept out of sight and switched off. The school will take no responsibility for lost or damaged phones. You can help by making sure that your child's clothing and equipment are clearly marked. Items found around the school can be reclaimed from Student Services. Lost property is only kept for a period of 3 to 6 months. The school cannot take responsibility for items that go missing when in your child's care.
